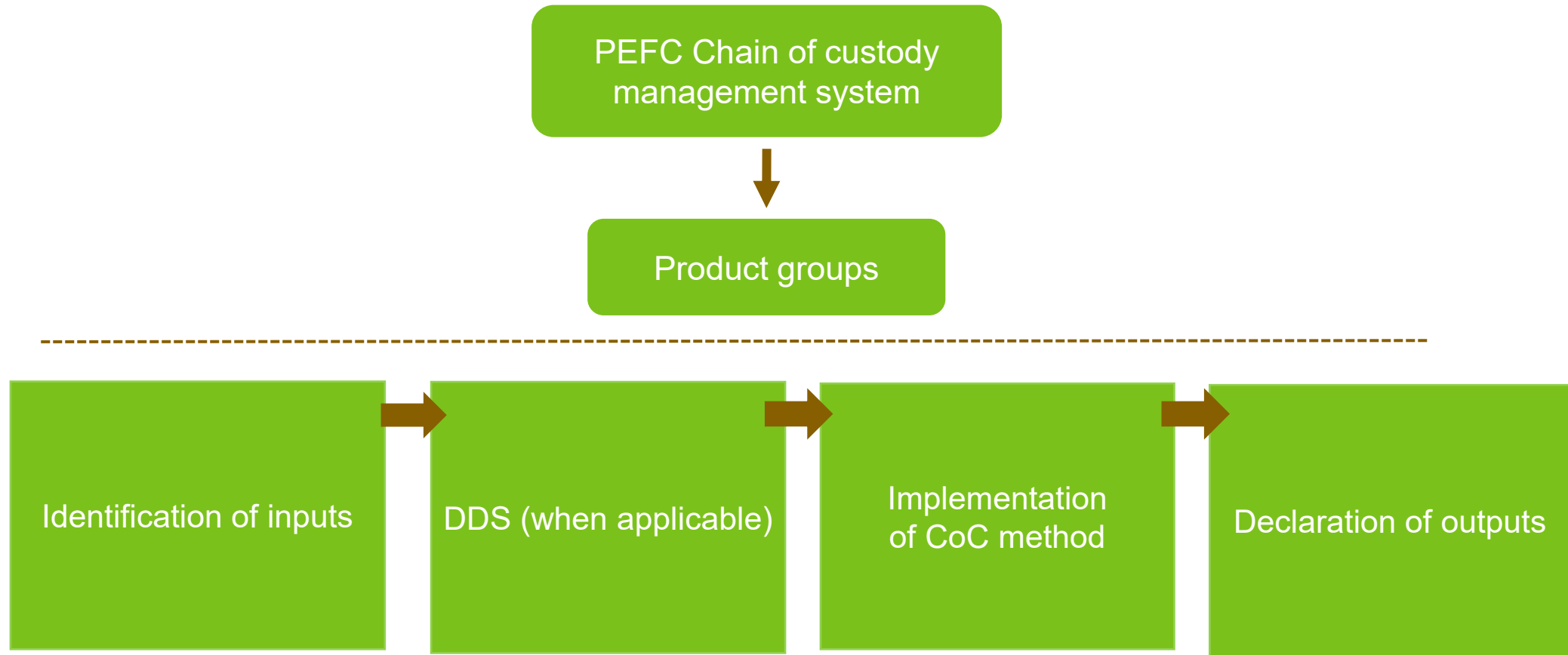

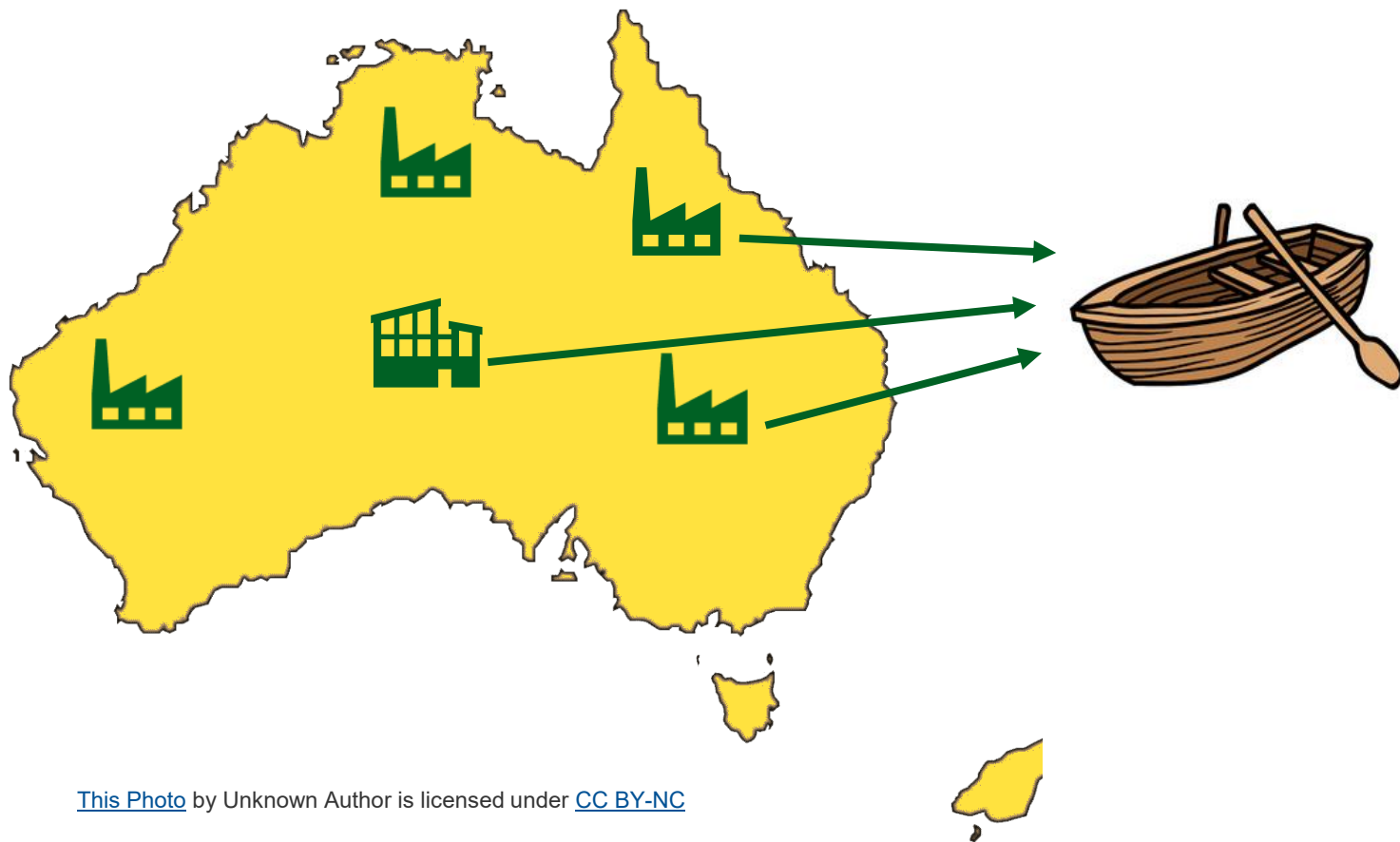

Editorial mistake Note 3 corrected: In case of multi-site organisations as defined in **Appendix 2, 2.3 a)** of this standard, PEFC product groups can cover several sites. ***Give attention to:** the **credit method** and the **percentage method** as they can be used at the level of multisites, across more than one site.

4.1.2 Scope of PEFC CoC Product Group

- General Requirements 4.1.2: In order to sell a product with a PEFC claim, the relevant **product category** should be included in the scope of certification of the organisation, to the **lowest level possible**.

5.1.1 Identification of inputs



Documentation need to be obtained for each delivery. However, it does not require the documentation to be obtained at the time of delivery. This requirement allows certificate holders to pass on the PEFC claim practically, particularly in the context of e-commerce.



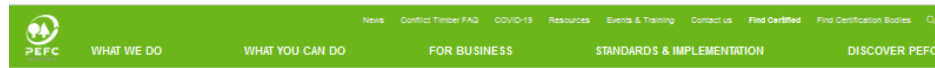
As per PEFC ST 2002, section 5.2.2 the organisation needs to specify the type of document in which the PEFC claims are made and passed on. The documentation should ensure that the claim is clearly associated with the delivery.

Identification of inputs



- For requirement 5.1.1 a), for the case of multi-site certificate, the supplier identification should include the address of the site(s) covered by the PEFC CoC certificate. See more requirement 7.2.1, PEFC ST 2003:2020

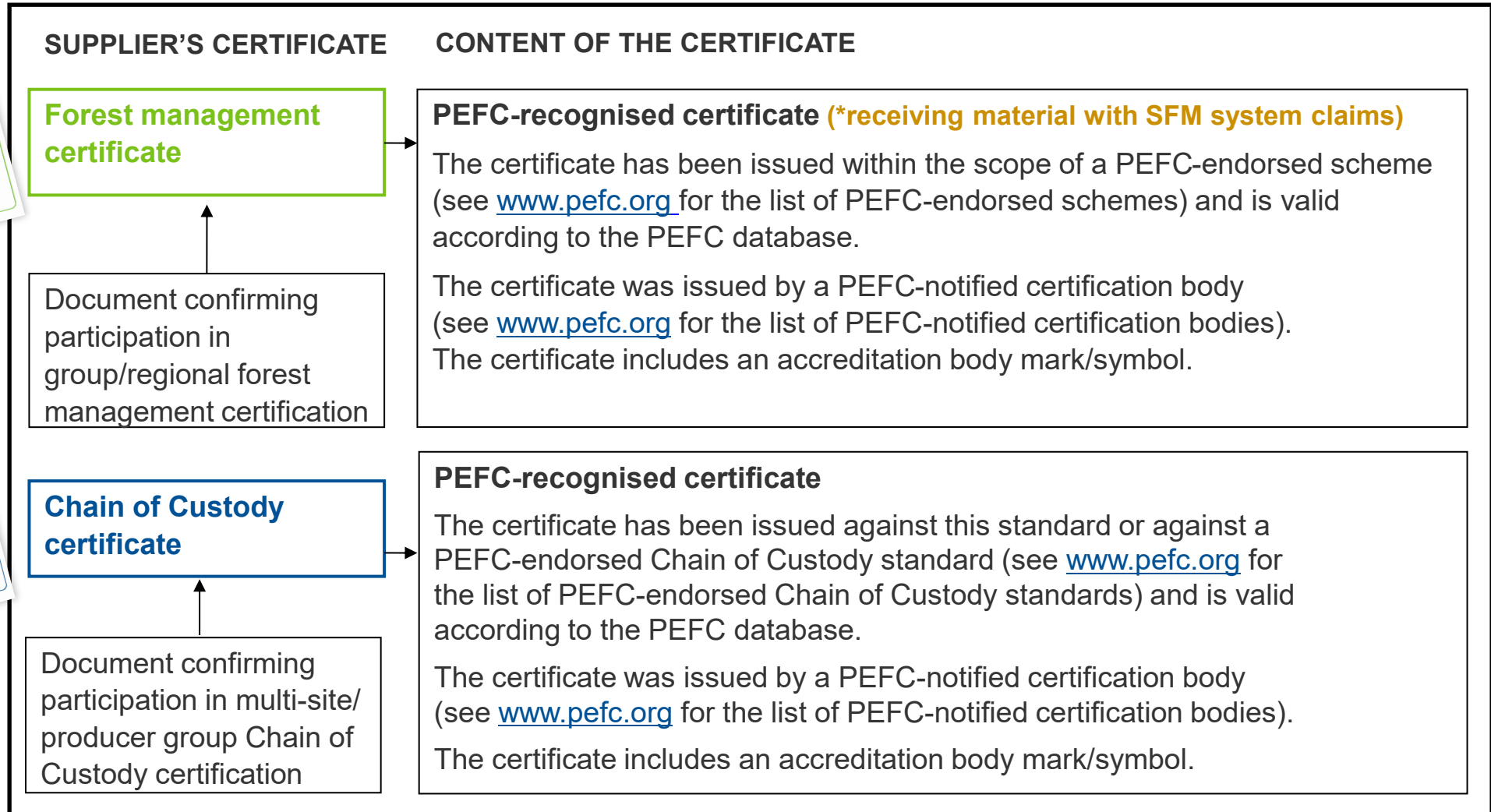

- Inputs delivered with a PEFC claim, the organisation shall verify the supplier status on the PEFC website.
- No requirement on when to verify as it will depend on the organisation.
- The organisation will determine how it will verify depending on the degree of confidence and risk.
- Materials delivered with the **100% PEFC Origin Claim/ SFM System claim** → Check whether the supplier used the **physical separation method**.

3.38 Supplier

Entity supplying material used as input for an **organisation's PEFC Chain of Custody PEFC product group**

Note 1: *Where products with a **PEFC claim** are physically delivered by an entity other than that having the ownership title to the material, the entity that is covered by a **PEFC-recognised certificate** and that has specified the **organisation** as **PEFC customer** is considered the **supplier** for the product/delivery in question.*

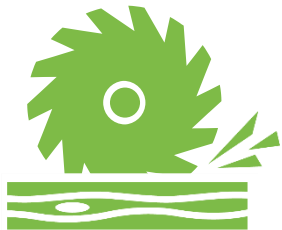

PEFC Material Categories & PEFC Claims on Input Material

Identification of input material – product identification (5.1.1.b)



Trees outside forests



Definition: Trees growing outside areas of nationally designated forest land.

TOF is to be considered as other material. If it is delivered under a PEFC claim, it is to be classified according to the PEFC claim (either as PEFC controlled sources or X% PEFC certified). It needs to go through the DDS, as per the material category under which it is classified.

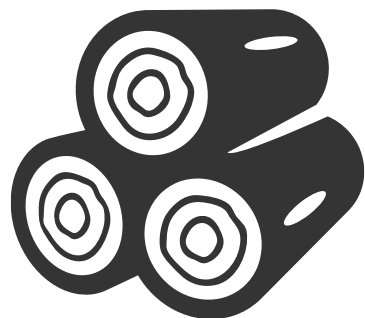

3.22 Other Material

Clarification for categorization of non-certified material from TOF areas

- Input material categorized as other material (including non-certified TOF) needs to go through PEFC DDS and **result to negligible risk categorization** to be classified as PEFC controlled sources.

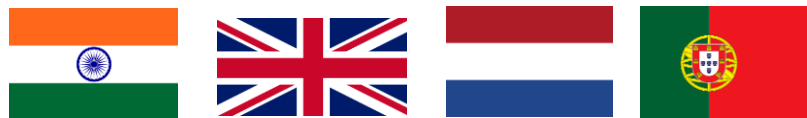

Trees Outside Forests (TOF) & DDS



Example for non-certified TOF material

A company receives timber from India without a claim and classifies as 'other material'.

During the first step of DDS they seek information from their supplier concerning the timber so that they can categorise the timber as PEFC Controlled sources.

Their supplier informs them that the timber is coming from a TOF area.

PEFC COC DDS process applies with guidance from section 4 of GD 2001.

Example for certified TOF material

A company receives timber from India with a PEFC claim.

Their supplier informs them that the timber is coming from a TOF area.

The validity of the certificate is checked using the PEFC website.

PEFC COC DDS process applies with guidance from section 4 of GD 2001.

When checking material with a PEFC claim originating from TOF areas, please verify the following:

1. **Does the country have an endorsed TOF standard?** → It could be a separate standard or appendix of their SFM standard.
 2. **Was the area TOF certified?** → Check that a valid certificate covers the TOF area.

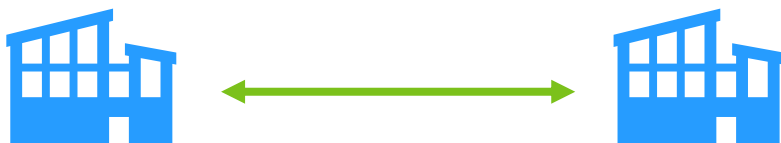
PEFC claim (3.27)

- Organisation's declaration on material/products, stated in sales and delivery documentation.
- Potential claims:
 - X% PEFC certified (and accepted translations) or X% PEFC
 - PEFC controlled sources (and accepted translations)
 - **100% PEFC Origin (3.27)**
 - **Endorsed SFM system claim** from forest owner (i.e. MTCC) (CoC ST 3.24, SFM ST 4.1.e), so defined on → **national SFM STs**
 - Accepted claims to be published on the **PEFC website**



Types of PEFC CoC Claims: Endorsed System Specific CoC STs

Endorsed system specific standards are published and updated on the GD.
Current endorsed CoC STs are: **SGEC** Standard Document 4, Chain of Custody of Forest and Tree based products - Requirements, **SFI** 2022 Chain of Custody ST (Section 4) and **CFCC** Part Five, Chain of Custody Requirements, **AS** 4707:2021 Chain of Custody of Forest and Tree based Products – Requirements.



Endorsed claims can only be used between companies certified against the endorsed system.



But when delivering to a PEFC certified company, they need to use the PEFC official claims.

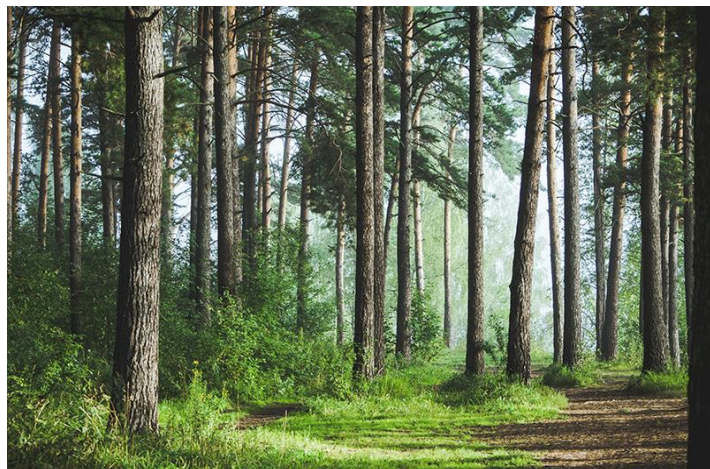

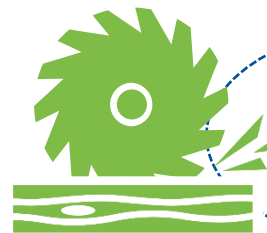
- Organisations using **physical separation method** may use “100% PEFC Origin” instead of “100% PEFC certified” for:
 - PEFC certified material delivered by a PEFC certified forest owner/manager:
 - with the claim “100% PEFC certified” or another PEFC endorsed system claim
 - and for PEFC certified material that was already delivered with the claim “100% PEFC Origin”
- Organisations implementing **percentage** or **credit method** consider it as “**100% PEFC certified**”

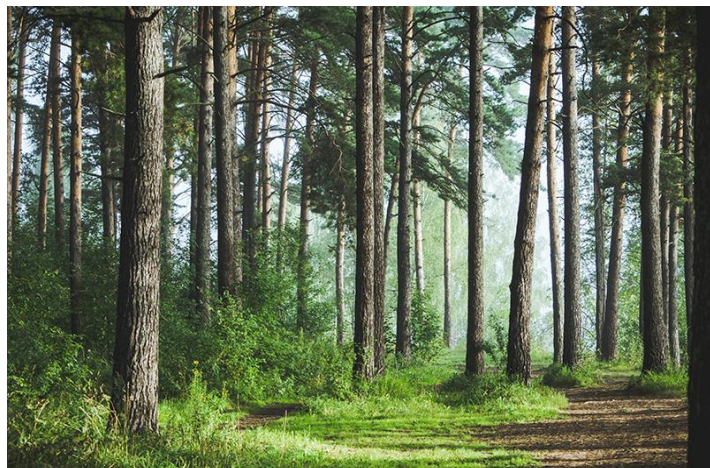

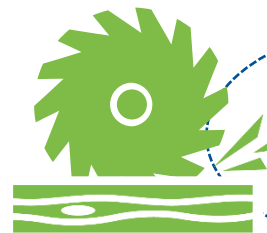

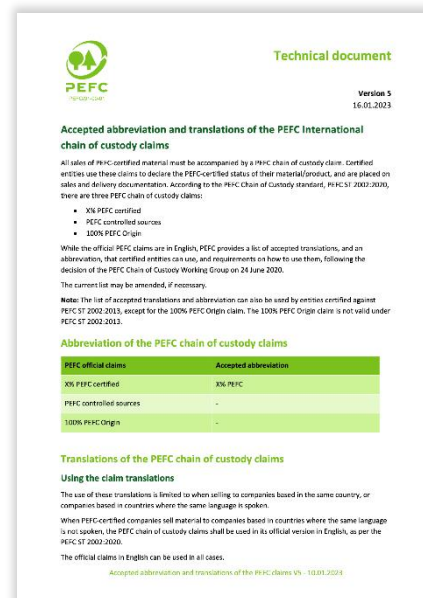
PEFC claim (3.27)

- To accept as translations of the PEFC claims the ones provided by the NGBs. However, limiting the usage of the translated claims to:
 - When selling to companies based on the same country or companies based in countries where the same language is spoken.
 - And using the claims as per PEFC ST 2002 when selling to companies based in countries where they do not speak the same language.
- In any case, companies can use the official claims in English.
- To be communicated to CBs through CoC training.

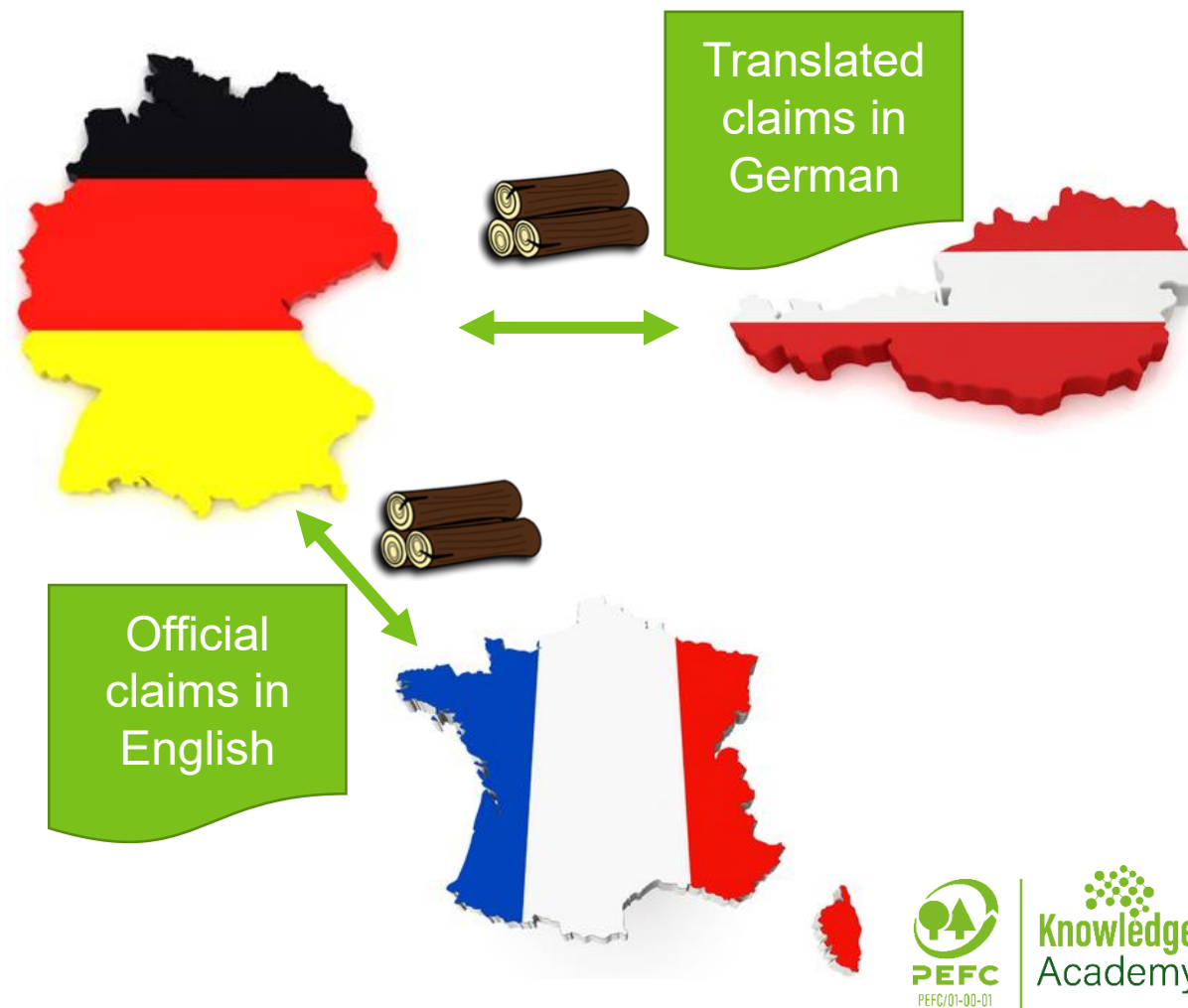

- **Endorsed SFM system claim** from forest owner (i.e. MTCC) (CoC ST 3.24, SFM ST 4.1.e), so defined on → **national SFM STs**
- Accepted abbreviation and translations of PEFC CoC claims and accepted SFM claims are published on the **PEFC website**
- **Conditions for National Endorsed CoC standards claims explained.**

Recycled Material



What is accepted as PEFC recycled material?

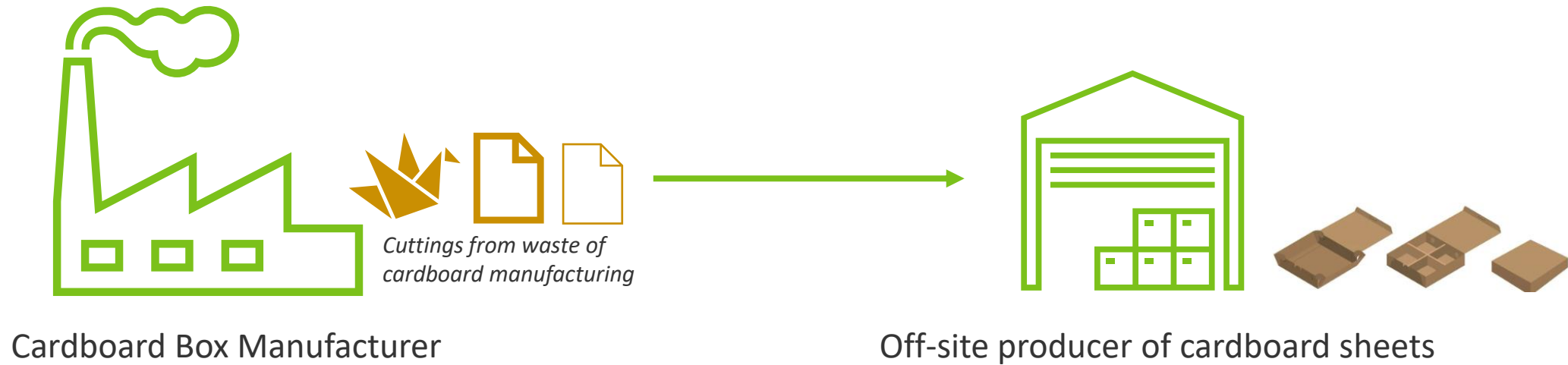
- i) Recovered from waste during a manufacturing process. **No** reutilisation of material capable of being reclaimed within the same process
- ii) Generated by end-users that the product can no longer be used for its intended purpose.

See ISO 14021:1999 lifecycle of materials

- Material delivered with a recycled claim from another certification system. It needs to meet PEFCs definition of recycled material
- Examples of documents & claims that could be accepted as recycled material: EN 643 classification, Product details, Producer claim, Legal statements, ISO 14021 claims, A Type iii Environmental Product Declaration, compliant with UNI EN 15804 and ISO 14025 (EPD)

3.35 Recycled Material



3.35 Recycled Material



Waste from private garden, such as twigs, branches in private gardens can be considered as recycled material provided that sufficient evidence is available to demonstrate the origin of the material in private garden, and that the material is indeed recycled. And this will be verified by the auditors.



The term 'waste' referred to the bullet 3.35 a), can be understood as per the following definition 'Any substance or object which the holder discards or intends or is required to discard.' (Source: Article 3, point (1), of Directive 2008/98/EC).

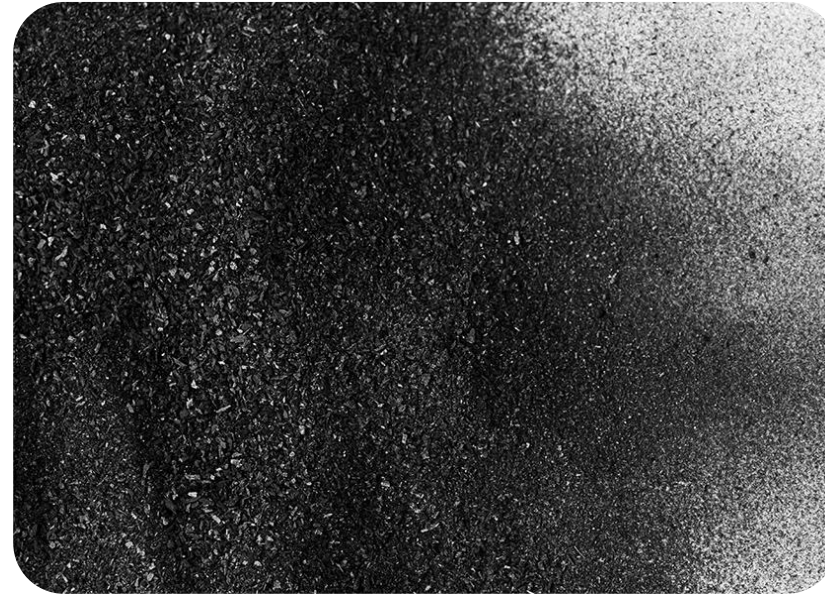

PEFC controlled sources

- PEFC material category and also PEFC claim for products for which the PEFC DDS has been implemented
 - PEFC claim for products not eligible for PEFC Certified claim
 - Demonstrates due diligence was exercised
- Sourcing "PEFC controlled sources" material
 - Exempt from risk assessment
 - Material category "PEFC controlled sources", NOT PEFC certified material!
- Areas of application
 - Limited/No access to PEFC certified material
 - Credit system, selling the non-certified part

Entity receiving from an **organisation** a **PEFC claim** for products, of which it obtains legal ownership and/or physical possession

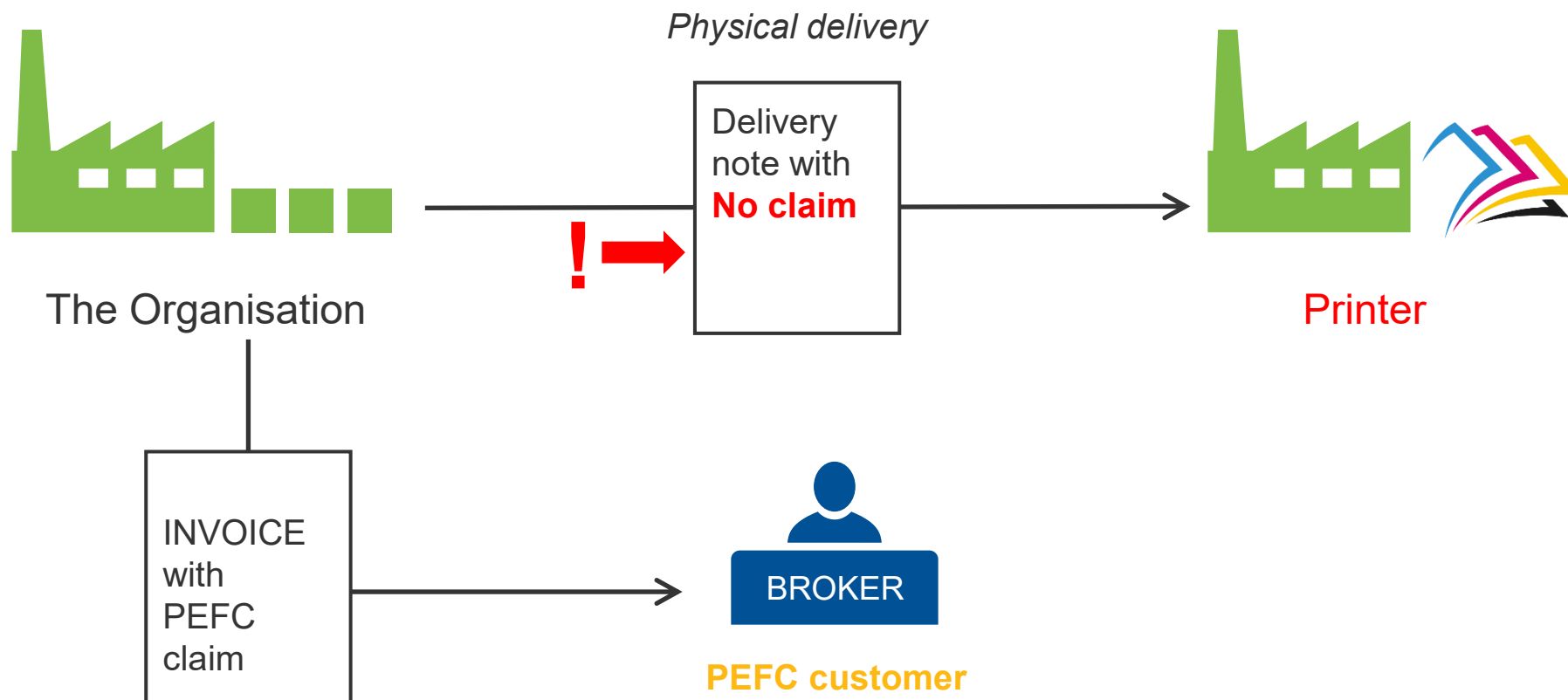
Note 1: Where material / products are physically delivered to an entity other than the entity that has obtained legal ownership of the material, the **organisation** shall appoint a single **PEFC customer** for the purpose of this definition, i.e. either the entity that obtains legal ownership or the entity that obtains physical possession of the material.

Note 2: The term **PEFC customer** can also refer to an internal customer within an **organisation**, if subsequent product groups have been established.

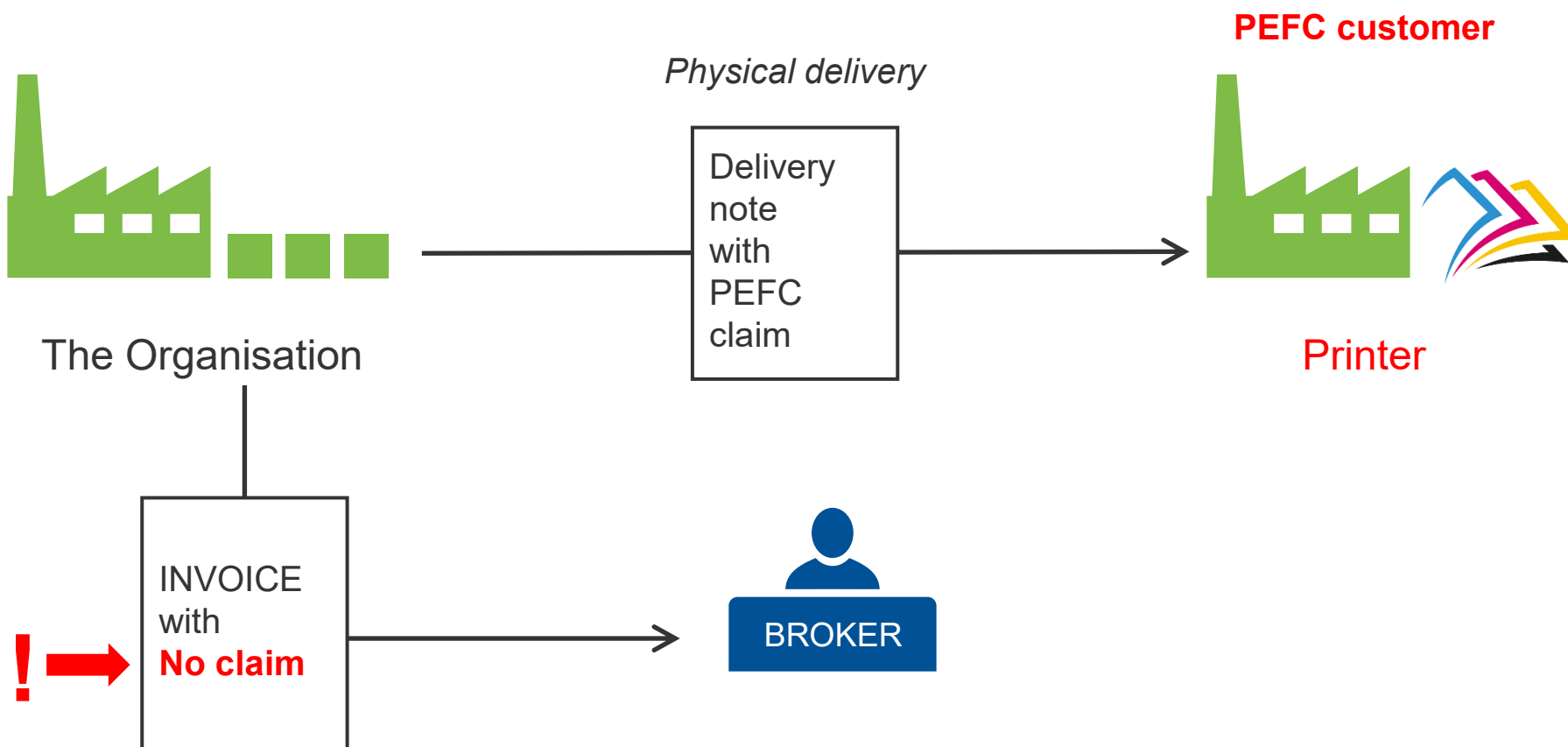

Declaration of outputs

- Whenever a PEFC certified organisation puts the PEFC on product trademarks on a PEFC certified product they produce, the organisation needs to **include the PEFC claim on the sales or delivery documentation**. See clarification to the requirement 7.1.1.1, chapter 5, PEFC 2001:2020 of this guidance document.



Trademark use (5.3)

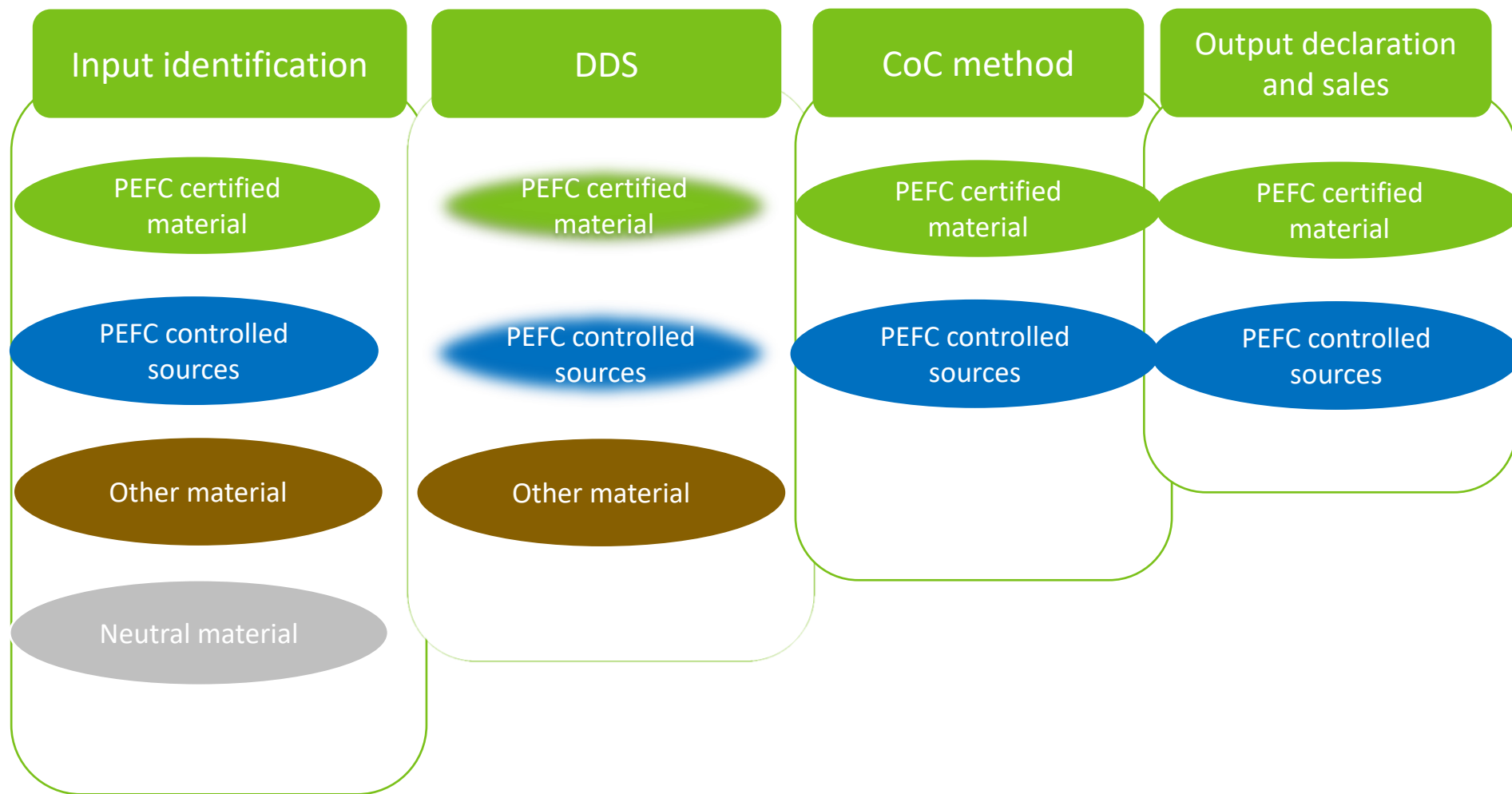
- Shall be in compliance with PEFC ST 2001:2020, Trademarks Rules - requirements
- **The organisation shall obtain a valid trademark license → Signing a trademarks licence contract mandatory** - usage of trademarks voluntarily

- No PEFC Label on PEFC controlled sources Products



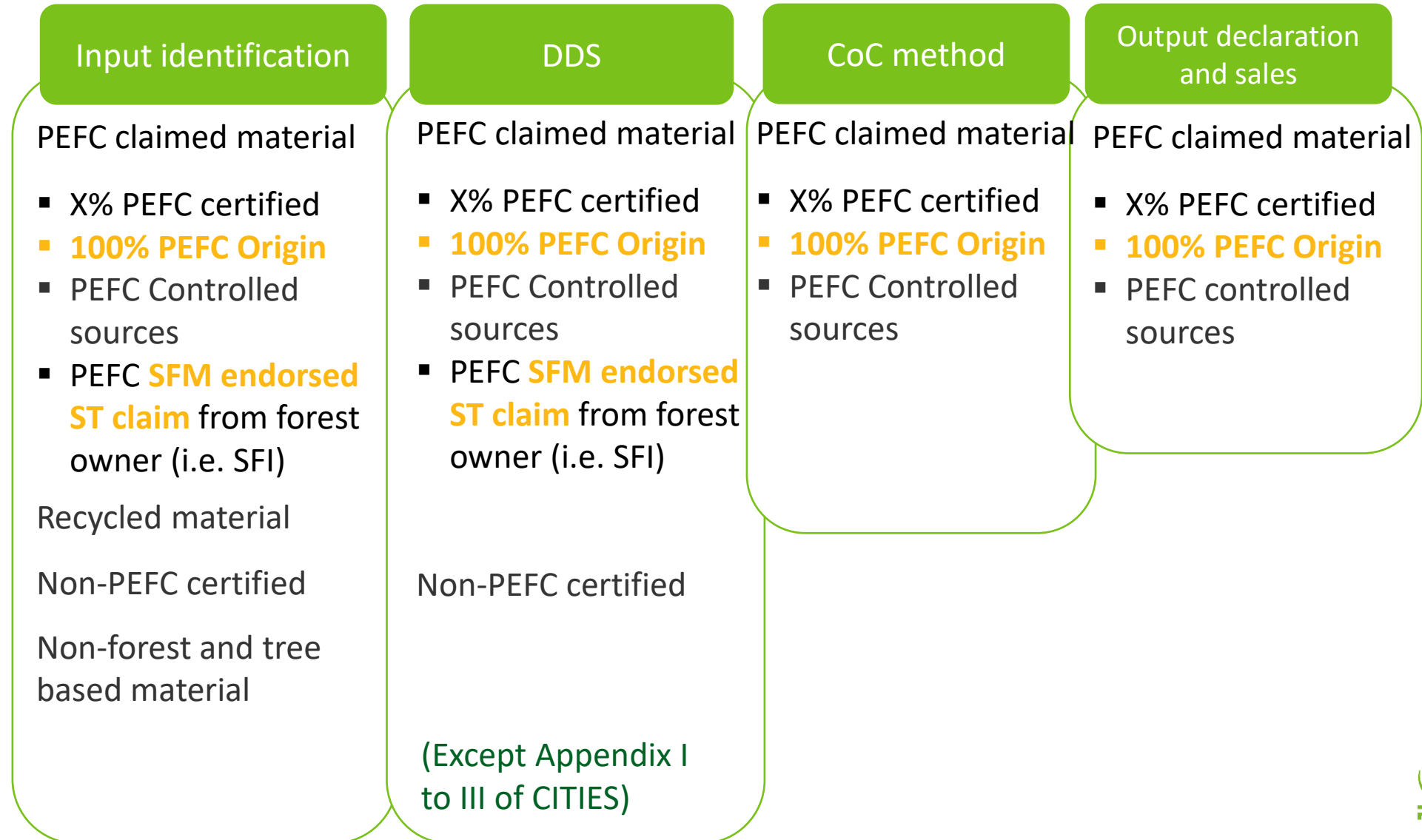
Summary of most important points

- Validity of supplier certificate checked on PEFC website → www.pefc.org
- CoC claims:
 - Official PEFC claims and abbreviations to be published on website
 - PEFC endorsed SFM ST claims to be published on the PEFC website
 - National CoC STs claims explained
 - New 100% PEFC Origin claim
- TOF is either certified, or non-certified material
- Trademarks licence mandatory
