## PEFC ST 2001, Trademarks Rules – Requirements defines:

- Ownership of the PEFC trademarks;
- The Scope of the PEFC trademarks;
- PEFC trademarks usage requirements;
- PEFC trademarks technical requirements;
- Graphic requirements of the PEFC labels.





### Ownership of the PEFC trademarks (chapter 4)

The PEFC Council owns two trademarks:





PEFC

Figurative mark with initials





- These trademarks are registered worldwide
- They must be used without R or TM symbols
- To be used, organisations shall hold a licence



#### 5.1.3: General scope of PEFC trademarks

In addition, the PEFC trademarks communicate an organisation's affiliation with PEFC or PEFC certification status.

#### Examples:

- Retailers procuring PEFC certified and labelled products
- Certification Bodies offering PEFC certification
- Organizations using finished PEFC certified products



# 6.1.1: PEFC TMS and PEFC CoC endorsed systems

 GD 2001:2025: Organisations certified against PEFC endorsed chain of custody are allowed to use the PEFC trademarks for its certified material, under the same conditions as the PEFC certified material (for example, an organization certified against SGEC chain of custody standard or the SFI Chain of Custody Chain of Custody Standard can make PEFC chain of custody claims or apply the PEFC on-product logo provided they comply with the applicable requirements in PEFC ST 2002:2020 -Chain of Custody of Forest and Tree Based Products -Requirements and PEFC ST 2001:2020 - PEFC Trademark Rules).





# Trademarks usage requirements

Chapter 6



#### General PEFC trademarks usage requirements

- To hold a PEFC trademarks usage licence, (or obtain a oneoff authorisation), except press and scientific articles
- To keep PEFC trademarks separated from other trademarks
- PEFC trademarks cannot be used next to other claims, messages or labels, if not clear what they refer to
- Mandatory use of the PEFC label generator
- To be legally compliance





# PEFC trademarks usage requirements – Trademarks usage licence

#### LICENCE

- Licence is obtained through signature of the PEFC trademarks usage contract
- SFM or CoC trademarks users must be certified
- CoC certified entities
  - mandatory to hold a licence,
  - so to sign a trademarks usage contract
  - trademarks usage is not mandatory
- The licence can cover several sites when they are part of a single legal entity
- PEFC Label Generator mandatory

#### Label generator

#### When can you get access to the new label generator

#### CoC certified entities

- When organisations get certified against the 2020 version of the CoC ST
- And have signed the revised trademarks usage contract or accepted the amendment to the current contract that covers also the PEFC initials
- In general, licence numbers will remain the same

#### Certification bodies

- When they have signed the revised trademarks usage contract or accepted the amendment to the current contract that covers also the PEFC initials
- In general terms licence numbers remain the same





#### Label generator

#### How and when can CBs check that trademarks usage contract is in place?

- 1. Certified entities adapt management procedures, as applicable
- 2. CBs audit against the 2020 version of the PEFC CoC ST and TM ST
- 3. CBs inform corresponding NGB that the company has passed the audit against the 2020 version of the standard.
- 4. The national member contacts the certified entity in order to sign new PEFC trademarks usage contract or for the entity to accept amendment(s) (the latest, one week after obtaining the certificate). To do so:
  - a) they can apply for an account on the new label generator or,
  - b) they can send an email to the NGB
- 5. The national member informs the CB that the new contract was signed within one week from the signature
- 6. CBs keep track of this.

## On-product: Indirect on media or marketing materials



- The brochure does not need to be certified
- The company promoting the certified products is responsible for this usage, not the printer of the brochure (unless they are the same company)

# Direct or indirect material used in production process



# On-product: Direct or indirect material used in production process

This whiskey was matured in a PEFC certified barrel.

The producer of the whiskey holds a CoC certificate that ensures the barrels are PEFC certified.



This usage shall be authorised by the PEFC Council.

The trademark message on the bottle of whiskey shall clarify what the trademark refers to.



## PEFC trademarks usage requirements – Trademarks users

PEFC trademarks users	On product	Off product
Group A: NGBs	X	<b>4</b>
Group B: SFM certified	X	$\checkmark$
Group C: CoC certified	<b>√</b>	<b>√</b>
Group D: Other users	*	$\checkmark$

On-product usage is not available for SFM entities



## 6.3.2.2 Group B: Entities certified against a PEFC endorsed sustainable forest management (SFM) standard

- SFM certified entities can only use the PEFC trademarks for off-product purposes.
- GD 2001:2025: PEFC initials used with the purpose of passing on PEFC claims are not considered as on-product usage.

The organisation is authorised to use the PEFC mark and to sell the following products as PEFC-certified:

#### Retailers & Brand owners – Same Group D

#### **Case Example:**

Lindt is procuring packaging from a PEFC CoC Certified packaging company. Lindt in this case is considered as an end user and can use the trademarks under the requirements of user group D. However, the packaging company needs to be PEFC CoC certified.

Chapter 7



#### 7.1.1.1 Technical Requirements – On-Product

• GD 2001:2025 clarifies that: In order for a product to use PEFC on-product label, the product needs to be communicated with the PEFC claim.

This clarification applies to the PEFC certified entity who is the

producer of the PEFC certified product







#### PEFC trademarks technical requirements

- The product the trademarks refer to shall be clear
  - label message or name of product if clarification needed
- To determine percentage of certified material, the complete product shall be considered









#### 7.1.2.1.3 Label Message

Examples: This table is from sustainably managed forests, recycled and controlled sources"; or "This brochure is from sustainably managed forests, recycled and controlled sources"; "This packaging is from sustainably managed forests, recycled and controlled sources"





#### 7.2.1.4 Use of the PEFC off-product label message

 The PEFC label message can be used alone, together with the licence number

Example: "Promoting sustainable forest management (PEFC XX-31-XX)"

#### PEFC trademarks technical requirements

#### ON-PRODUCT USAGE – TWO LABELS







#### **ON-PRODUCT**

#### **PEFC** certified label - requirements



Minimum 70% certified material content Maximum 99.99% recycled material content



#### **ON-PRODUCT**

#### PEFC certified label – label message requirements

If no recycled content

If only material from PEFC certified forests







#### **ON-PRODUCT**

#### **PEFC** recycled label - requirements



100% material coming from recycled sources

(as per PEFC's definition of recycled material)



#### **ON-PRODUCT**

#### **PEFC on-product labels – requirements**

- The product the label refers to shall be clearly identified.
  - In the label message, [this product] may be replaced by the name of the certified product or the certified material included.





#### **PEFC** initials on product – requirements

- Same requirements as PEFC certified label (i.e. min. 70% of certified content)
- Together with the organisation's trademarks licence if no logo on the product
- Clear what they refer to





# Technical requirements

Off-product usage



#### **OFF-PRODUCT**

- Usage on non-commercial products allowed if:
  - clear; and
  - label message included
- Same requirements for the initials
- Alternative promotional label messages are listed in Appendix 1 of PEFC ST





## 6.2.4 Off-product PEFC trademarks usage

 For the purposes of off-product PEFC trademarks usage, the PEFC Council or the corresponding PEFC authorised body may issue permission for one-off trademarks usage.



#### **ELEMENTS**

- 1) PEFC logo
- PEFC licence number (is meant to identify the trademarks user)
- 3) Label name
- 4) Label message
- 5) Website



The trademark shall not be used with the <sup>R</sup> or <sup>TM</sup> symbols.



#### **COLOURS**









#### ORIENTATION, DIMENSIONS & MINIMUM SIZE

#### Landscape



The ratio and proportions of the PEFC label shall not be modified.

#### Portrait







#### **PLACEMENT**





The minimum amount of surrounding clear space in order to ensure the label is uncluttered and easily recognisable.

## Optional usage for the PEFC certified label

#### **NEW OPTIONAL ELEMENTS**



For on-product usage, if no message the label may include the name of the product.



## Optional usage for the PEFC recycled label

#### **NEW OPTIONAL ELEMENTS**



For on-product PEFC recycled label usage, if no message the label may include the name of the product. The label name cannot be omitted.



## Optional usage for the promotional label

#### **NEW OPTIONAL ELEMENTS**



For off-product usage, the label message may be omitted whenever it is clear from the context in which the label appears what PEFC stands for.



#### **Omission of License Number**

Requires written approval from PEFC Authorised Body

- Licence number would be:
  - Not readable
  - Not feasible to place on product
- Conditions
  - PEFC trademark with number on other parts of product, or
  - Licensee can be identified clearly through alternative means



## 6.2.5 PEFC Labels exceptional usage without licence number

- Approval by the PEFC authorized body.
- Approval for this kind of exceptional usage is to be requested through the PEFC Label Generator

Examples of acceptable circumstances:

- On business cards
- On pencils

#### **OPTIONAL DESIGN**


Where the design does not allow the usage of the normal designs, new optional designs may be used, prior approval of the **PEFC authorised body**:









## Exceptional Use of PEFC Graphics – Label generator







#### Exceptional usage of the PEFC label

Request approval for exceptional usage of the PEFC label for this product. Exceptional usage covers any use of the PEFC label in a non-standard way, such as creating the label in a different colour, placing it on a non-solid background and removing the licence number.





- All PEFC trademarks have no "TM" symbol
- Including those used on websites, presentations etc.
